Japa Kuutniemi and Rob Turner are looking to improve on their times, Rob looking to break into the 5 second zone for the first time in the TMFC. It's a proven car, having run well down into the 5's in the hands of Jeff Carroll who raced it in the USA. Jürgen Nagel is last but by no means least. He found a fuel system problem at Santa Pod and is confident that he can make a big improvement this weekend.

The flying Habermann brothers, numbers 1 and 2 in Europe in 2010, are entered and Timo was top qualifier at he last race. Bother Dennis could only manage 6th place, but was trying to overcome fuel system problems. Derek Flynn showed continued good form, having won the last race of 2010 and qualifying number 2 at the Main Event. Fred Hanssen was third and, as Will Hanna's latest report on Eurodragster says, they know they can do better. Dave Wilson continues what is billed as his 'farewell tour' and is more confidant in his ability to tune the A-Fuel dragster. He would like to add a 6<sup>th</sup> FIA Championship to his name before he hangs up the driving gloves for good. Tierp is the first race for Peter Schoefer, in the red and silver dragster from Germany. They finished 5<sup>th</sup> in the Chapionship last year but have won the title in 2008 and want to do it again. Krister Johanssen is another racer looking to do well in front of his 'home crowd' and always a threat in any race, having run well down into the 6.30s. The A-Fuel car of Esko Raisvuo and the blown methanol car of Paul-Ingar Udtian complete the field. Paul-Ingar was at Round One but could only manage the bump sport and Esko starts his championship campaign here. This will be fast and furious qualifying, with fast cars and only places day
